GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS
CLAY COUNTY FAIR ASSOCIATION, INC.
POLICY F-7
LIVESTOCK COMPETITION

- F-7.1.** The Clay County Fair encourages livestock competition managed with strict adherence to applicable rules and generally accepted standards of conduct. Cheating or any other violation of show ring ethics will not be tolerated; offenders will be eliminated from participation and dealt with to the full extent of the Fair's authority and the law. (4/17/12)
- F-7.2.** The Clay County Fair reserves to its Executive Committee the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incidental to the Fair. (4/17/12)
- F-7.3.** Any person who violates any of the following rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Fair may order. (4/17/12)
- F-7.4.** The Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage to or of exhibits. (12/21/21)
- F-7.5.** No more than two entries in one class allowed an exhibitor, unless otherwise indicated. No exhibitor may win more than two prizes in any one class. (Editorial-6/7/17)
- F-7.6.** All applications for entries must be made in accordance with guidelines found in the appropriate department exhibitor handbook. The Clay County Fair reserves the right to accept or reject any entry offered. (2/20/18)
- F-7.7.** All exhibits must remain in place until the stated release time in each department. (4/17/12)
- F-7.8.** Exhibitor questions on premium amounts or ribbon placing must be received on or before October 15, or no adjustments or corrections will be able to be made. Premium checks will be issued after that date. There will be no reissuing of lost premium checks, and premium checks that are issued will become void after 45 days. All awards, ribbons, and exhibits not picked up at the Fair Administrative Offices by October 15 will be forfeited and become property of the Clay County Fair. (2/20/18)
- F-7.9.** The Fair reserves the right to deduct any outstanding invoices from premium checks before they are mailed to exhibitors. Outstanding invoices may include, but are not limited to, admission, parking, camping, entry fees, livestock bedding, and veterinary services. (2/8/22)
- F-7.10.** The Fair will use diligence to ensure the safety of stock or articles entered for exhibition, after their arrival and placement, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or articles on exhibition. The exhibitor shall indemnify the Fair management against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. (4/17/12)
- F-7.11.** Any animal eligible to be shown must be owned by the exhibitor when entry is made unless otherwise indicated in specific departmental rules. (2/19/19)

- F-7.12.** Firms and partnerships entering for competition must be in existence at the time of entry, and in all cases must be bona fide. Affidavits of the age of the firm may be required by the Fair. (4/17/12)
- F-7.13.** No animals may be entered or shown unless they have been recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds, except in case of young stock as otherwise provided for in special rules. Exhibitors must produce certificates of registry to the superintendent in charge anytime during the Clay County Fair. (4/17/12)
- F-7.14.** No refunds on entry fees will be made. (4/19/22)
- F-7.15.** All animals, except those being nursed, must be entered and shown in competition according to classes for their respective breed and species. (4/17/12)
- F-7.16.** Where there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, judges may at their discretion award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animals or articles deserve. (4/17/12)
- F-7.17.** For purebred breed shows, entries must be received from a minimum of three or more unrelated exhibitors who will exhibit a total of 12 or more animals in each breed offered for each species (unless otherwise specifically noted). At the time entries close, if sufficient entries are not received for a given breed, that show may not be held and the entry fees returned or breeds may be combined in an “All Other Breed” show. (12/21/21)
- F-7.18.** All livestock trailers and trucks used by livestock exhibitors must be parked in the designated area in the north parking lot (north of West 18th Street). (4/17/12)
- F-7.19.** A Clay County Fair department superintendent may not make a competitive entry directly in a Clay County Fair department over which that person has supervisory responsibility. (4/17/12)
- F-7.20.** All animals entered must be exhibited in the division and class in which they are entered. (Editorial-6/7/17)
- F-7.21.** No premiums will be awarded to any entries which have not been classified. (4/17/12)
- F-7.22.** A faithful observance of all rules governing the exhibit will be required and when in doubt as to the application or meaning of a rule, the superintendent in charge shall construe the same. This opinion, when required by either exhibitor or judge, must be reduced to writing and returned with the award sheet. (4/17/12)
- F-7.23.** The decisions of the official veterinarian will be final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion not discovered at the time of the award, is apparent. In such cases, the decision of the Fair’s executive committee will be final. (4/17/12)
- F-7.24.** In case of protest of an animal or exhibit, notice must be given the superintendent of the department during the day of examination of the animal or article protested, and a written statement giving the reasons for protesting, verified by affidavit, with names of witnesses, must be filed with the Fair. (4/17/12)
- F-7.25.** The right of an exhibitor to appeal from the decision of a judge to the Fair will lie only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit; or when it is charged that the decision of the judge has been influenced or interfered with by another. (4/17/12)

- F-7.26.** All questions of dispute or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to the Fair’s Executive Committee whose decision shall be final. (4/17/12)
- F-7.27.** The owner/exhibitor for each animal brought to the Fair must comply with the most up-to-date “Health Requirements For Exhibition of Livestock, Poultry and Birds at State Fair and District Shows” that are published annually by the State Veterinarian and the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship, as well as any additional rules and regulations regarding animal care and animal health found in the Fair’s exhibitor handbooks, on the Fair’s website, or in other correspondence between the Fair and the exhibitor. (12/21/21)
- F-7.28.** All the animals presented for exhibition at the Fair shall be subjected to examination by the Fair Veterinarian upon arrival and to daily inspections during the exhibition, even in situations where health papers for each animal are required. Separate health papers are required for each species. (12/21/21)
- F-7.29.** The Fair reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone when such refusal is deemed to be in the Fair’s best interest. (4/17/12)
- F-7.30.** Limited livestock exhibitor camping is available on the inner Campgrounds. Requests for camping are limited to those individuals exhibiting livestock and may be made at the time of entry. (2/20/18)
- F-7.31.** Camping may be reserved for the Friday before the fair through Wednesday at noon, Wednesday of the fair at 2pm through Sunday, or for the full week. Campers may not be brought in before 2pm the day they are reserved, and must leave prior to 12pm the final day of the reservation. (2/20/18)
- F-7.32.** Each camper may have only one vehicle (with a parking pass) parked in the lot. Any additional vehicles will be requested to be moved. (2/20/18)

**INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE)
CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS**

- F-7.33.** Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the “IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics,” fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

A. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

B. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.

C. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

D. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which cumulates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internal or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

E. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal is prohibited.

F. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

G. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

H. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

I. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

J. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.

K. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statutes, regulations or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions. Horse Department Guidelines

1. Enter online at www.claycountyfair.com or complete appropriate forms available from the Clay County Fair Administrative Offices. **ALL entries must be received on or before August 22. NEW 2022!!! No late entries will be accepted.**
2. **WITH THE LATE ENTRY DEADLINE, NO NEW ENTRIES WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE SHOW.**
3. **NEW 2022!!!** Stall fees are \$20.00 per box stall (including miniature horses). **This fee does NOT include bedding. This fee applies for both horse and tack stalls.**
4. **Exhibitors will be responsible for furnishing their own bedding**, either by purchase at registration or by supplying their own. Bedding supplied by the exhibitor **must be wood shavings only** (no paper bedding, straw, hay, pellets, sawdust, or other materials allowed). Additional bedding will be available for purchase at the Fair. Mangers or feed racks are not provided.
5. Exhibitors must keep bedding clean and free of glass, plastics, cans and other trash for recycling purposes.
6. All exhibitors will be responsible for their own stall/pen clean-out.
7. The Horse Barn has 195 nine feet by nine feet box stalls with sliding front gates. They are solid to four feet high (seven feet in back), with three feet of horizontal bars. Horses may also be stalled in the "East-West" Barn and the former Small Animal Barn. Stalls may not be reserved for horses not entered in the show. **Clay County Fair management cannot guarantee availability of all stalls purchased. Stall assignments will be at the discretion of the department superintendent.**
8. **FIRST WEEKEND EXHIBITORS:** Tack stalls will be on a first-come, first-served basis of **one for every four horses**. This can mean four horses owned by one family or four horses owned by a group of people. **If you wish to have tack stalls, you MUST PAY FOR THEM (\$20 each)** and if you are part of a group you MUST let the Superintendent know who is in your “group.” If you are in a group, designate one person to reserve and pay for the tack stall(s). If you are not part of a group and do not have four horses, the Superintendent will try to assign you to a group for a tack stall (to be paid for at the show if it is used) but it is not guaranteed. **Tack Lockers will also be assigned and can be used along with or instead of a tack stall.**
9. **NEW 2022!!** There will be **NO refunds** of admission tickets, bedding, entry fees, stockman’s passes, or stalls purchased.
10. An admission ticket is required each day an exhibitor enters the Clay County Fair. **Livestock Exhibitor Admission Tickets** may be purchased at time of entry (before August 22) for \$7.00. After August 22, advance admission tickets are \$8.00 or \$10.00 at the gate during the Fair. Children age 12 and under are free every day of the Fair.

11. Exhibitors may purchase **Stockman Livestock Parking** permit(s) for livestock vehicle parking on the fairgrounds. Permit must be purchased in advance and costs \$20.00 for the show period of your entry. Parking is assigned in a color-coded area. **Free parking is available in the North Parking Lot.**

12. The livestock entry gate (Gate E) is located in the southwest corner of the fairgrounds.

13. Empty livestock trailers will be parked in designated areas in the North Parking Lot. Check location with the superintendent.

14. All horses shall be accompanied by a health certificate with individual identification. **Health certificate must be turned into the clerk upon arrival on the grounds for inspection by the veterinarian.** Out of state horses will have had a Coggins test within the last 12 months.

Entry Times

15. Paints, Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Ponies – stalls available Friday, Sept. 9 at 3:00pm; horses must be in stalls **AND ENTRIES CHECKED IN** by 9:00am on Saturday, Sept. 10.

16. Ponies, Miniatures – stalls available Friday, Sept. 16 at noon; horses must be in stalls by 6:00pm on Friday, Sept. 16.

17. Pleasure Driving Horses, Draft Horses – stalls available Friday, Sept. 16 at **2:00pm**; horses must be in stalls by **8:00am** on Saturday, Sept. 17.

NOTE: THE ABOVE ENTRY TIMES ARE WHEN STALLS ARE GUARANTEED TO BE READY. IF YOU CHOOSE TO ENTER SOONER THAN THE ABOVE-LISTED TIME, BE AWARE THAT YOU MAY BE DENIED ENTRY AT THE GATE AND/OR YOU MAY HAVE TO WAIT IN YOUR TRAILER UNTIL STALLING AREAS ARE PREPARED.

Release Times

18. Paints, Appaloosas, and Quarter Horses will be released no earlier than 5:00pm or after the end of the show on Monday, September 12; all other horses released after the end of the show on Sunday, Sept. 18. *If later release time is necessary, contact the superintendent no later than 2 p.m. on release day.*

Entries for Show

19. Breed determines the division the horse is to be shown in and the class number defines the classification in the division. In case of a crossbred horse, the division is to be determined by the exhibitor, but the animal may be shown in more than one class. The age of the horse will be computed from January 1 of the year in which entry is foaled. Registration papers may be required at time of entry. Registration papers **MUST** be presented to show office if a horse will be shown in two different breeds.

20. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE ISSUED FOR SCRATCHED CLASSES OR ENTRY ERRORS. IT IS UP TO EACH OWNER/EXHIBITOR TO DOUBLE-CHECK ENTRIES AT THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE ENTRY DEADLINE.**

21. Entries in classes will be made **ONLINE** when reserving stalls and camping. Once you are at the show, you will check in, get your number, confirm all entries and make any necessary changes. Office hours are Friday, September 9 from 6:00pm-8:00pm, Saturday, Sept. 10 beginning at 7:30am, Friday, Sept. 16 from Noon-1 hour after the end of halter classes, and Saturday, Sept. 17 beginning at 7:30am. Entry fees are \$6.00 per class (**NEW 2022!! except for jackpot Barrels, Halter, Western Pleasure and Walk-Trot, fees for those classes are \$10**), due when entries are made online. Entries must be finalized for the entire weekend/show by 9:30am on Saturday, Sept. 10 and/or 8:30am on Saturday, Sept. 17. **THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS ENTRIES IN DRAFT HORSE EVENTS ON SATURDAY NIGHT, SEPTEMBER 17, CAN ENTER AT SHOW WITH ENTRIES CLOSING ONE HALF-HOUR PRIOR TO SHOW START.**

22. The contracted judge, horse superintendent or horse show management reserve the right to combine classes at any time.

Judging Ring

23. Participants in lot being judged, judges and ring stewards ONLY allowed in judging ring. **EXCEPTIONS are that very young exhibitors showing halter/PeeWee classes may have an adult assist them, also Ranch Horse Conformation (see below).**

Veterinarian

24. A state veterinarian will be on hand to approve or disapprove health papers. Decisions of the veterinarian are final.

Rules and Regulations for FIRST WEEKEND

25. Age of Exhibitors and Horses is as of January 1.

26. Entries in Hunter In Hand and Ranch Horse Conformation are also eligible to show in their respective breed/sex halter class.

27. Ranch Horse Conformation: Entries will enter the ring individually under saddle and walk/trot as judge directs, dismount, ground tie, and unsaddle for conformation judging. Once judging is complete, exhibitors are to saddle and re-mount. Exhibitors who need physical assistance with tacking/dismount/mount are allowed to have an assistant enter the ring for those portions only.

28. Open "Retro" Western Pleasure is open to any age horse and rider. No fake tails allowed. Banding manes is optional. Extra credit will be given to clothing and tack of the 1960s, 70s, 80s. Horses should move more forward and look through the bridle as they did during this time period. Judging will be 60 percent on brokenness/movement and 40 percent on turnout. Audience participation may be used in the judging process.

29. Tandem Bareback entries – ONE rider is to make the entry. That person will be the one who is paid any premium. The second rider can be named at the office during check-in. Any premium split is to be worked out between the two riders privately. The fair will NOT split premiums.

30. All exhibitors must enter the arena during game classes in a controlled manner. No "running the gate." Exhibitor may start pattern prior to gate closing. Gate will be closed until exhibitor has stopped pattern.

31. A “NOVICE” exhibitor is one who is in their first THREE years of showing horses. This is on the honor system. Holding a “novice” card in a breed association does NOT necessarily qualify you for novice classes at the CCF. Persons participating in the novice classes are limited to these riding classes for entire show PLUS the “Rookie” and “Grandma/Grandpa Walk-Trot” if exhibitor is otherwise eligible for those classes, and the Costume class, and Halter/Showmanship.

32. Exhibitors can enter EITHER the PeeWee OR the Jr Youth class where both are offered, but NOT BOTH. PeeWees can be led through the game patterns if needed.

33. Attire for game classes will be hat **or helmet** and long-sleeve shirt.

34. While every opportunity will be given for exhibitors to use the show arena for schooling, we ask that exhibitors understand that other events beyond the horse show will be using the facility. Exhibitors are requested to be respectful of the other events being held and to plan their riding time accordingly. A schooling area will be located on the east end of the horse arena. Please be mindful of the horses preparing to compete and keep safety as the top priority whenever working your horse.

35. **NOTE!** Please keep in mind that this show is unlike most that you attend during the rest of the year. This is a spectator event, and as such there is lots of foot traffic through the barns. Please keep your stall area as pedestrian-friendly as possible. **If you wish to block off your portion of the alleyway for show prep, you MUST clear it with the Superintendent when you are checking in.** Please be a good neighbor! Any barrier, tie, or other such obstruction **must** be removed once horses are no longer in the alleyway. **If this privilege is abused in 2022, it will not be allowed moving forward.**

36. The gravel area between the barns and arena is **NOT** to be used for schooling. It is a staging area **ONLY**. There is high pedestrian traffic in this area and the ground is **not** suitable for working horses. Please be respectful of fair spectators, other exhibitors, and your own horse and do **NOT** trot/lope/longe in this area!

Rules and Regulations for Pleasure Driving and Draft Horse Exhibitors

37. At no time will draft horses be allowed to be driven on any vehicle in areas of the fairgrounds where the Fair management has not previously granted permission to do so.

38. Numbers must be visible in the ring.

39. In all hitch classes, horse or horses must be sound and shall be shown hitched to a suitable vehicle and the driver shall be clean and neatly dressed.

40. In all hitch classes, the driver will be allowed one helper; no other riders will be permitted on the wagon while the hitch is being shown. In any hitch classes where more than two horses are shown, two capable drivers must be on the wagon.

41. In hitch classes where more than two horses are shown, they may be owned by one or more exhibitors. Be sure only one entry is made for each hitch.

42. Juniors age will be determined as of January 1 in the year of the show. Junior driving classes will be judged on driving ability and not on the quality of horses. An adult capable of driving horses must accompany all juniors. Juniors may not show a stallion in any class. **Juniors entered in the Junior Driving classes can ONLY compete in those driving classes during the CCF with the exception that they may also participate in the Saturday evening events and Reinsmanship.**

43. Hitch classes will be judged according to quality of horses, equipment and the ability of the driver to handle his/her horses at the command of the judge. An uncontrollable horse may be excused at any time by the discretion of the judge or ringmaster.

44. Due to a high volume of traffic throughout the Horse Barn and in anticipation of a large number of hitches, draft horse exhibitors will be allowed to close off their aisles in order to prepare horses for the show.

45. Harness may also be stored in a designated area as well as a select number of trailers, trucks, and semis. This area will be secured at night.

46. Youth Decorating classes will be held inside in a designated open aisle of the barn.

47. Entries in the Antique Buggy classes can **NOT** have rubber tires. Any exception must be cleared by show staff prior to entering the show pen.

48. Exhibitors coming for ONLY the Saturday evening events may not enter the Fairgrounds prior to the end of the noon performance. Exhibitors will be required to leave once the evening's classes have ended. More information regarding stall availability, etc., will be made available closer to the event.

49. **NEW!!!** Class 6021, Reinsmanship, is open to any single-hitch exhibitor (mini, pony, horse, draft). The class will consist of drivers individually working a pattern set by the judge, meant to determine the skill of the driver. This is a judged event, not timed and not an obstacle course. Youth under the age of 16 are allowed to compete; however, an adult must be on the seat with them if driving anything other than a mini. Adult is not to coach Youth while performing the pattern. Pattern will be drawn and available for exhibitor review prior to the show. Judging will be passed primarily on ability of driver to successfully perform the pattern maneuvers, with additional consideration given to the turnout and how appropriate it is to the respective style of hitch. Any suitable two- or four-wheel vehicle may be used.

Rules and Regulations for Miniature Horse/Donkey/Mule Exhibitors

50. Miniature horse halter classes are separated into two categories - under 34" and over 34" to 38". Miniature donkey/mule are to be 38" and below.

51. **ALL REGISTERED MINATURES MUST PRESENT PROOF OF HEIGHT AT TIME OF CHECK-IN.** Any miniature who is not registered/does not hold a current measurement card WILL be measured before they are allowed to enter the show ring.
